






17 Nobel Prize winners either backed by or involved in the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions between 2012 and 2023

DURATION Max 4 years (max 5 years for Joint Doctorates only)

COMPOSITION Min 3 organisations in 3 different EU MS or HE AC (at least 1 MS)



FELLOWSHIP Between 3 and 36 months (up to 48 months for Joint Doctorates only)



BUDGET 540 PM





Doctoral Networks (Standard): A consortium of at least 3 entities offering innovative doctoral training in academia and/or non-academia.

Industrial Doctorates: Doctoral candidates step outside academia to develop skills in industry and business by being jointly supervised by the academic and nonacademic organisations.

Joint Doctorates: Highly integrated doctoral training leading to joint, double or multiple doctoral degrees and with the candidate selection and supervision jointly done by the degree-awarding institutions.



Features

Size:

• Up to 540 person-month

Duration:

- **Programme**: Max 48 months (60 for JD)
- Fellowship: Between 3 and 36 months (48 for JD)
- Secondments: Up to 1/3 of fellowship duration for standard DN and with no upper limit for Industrial and Joint doctorates
- Industrial Doctorate: Minimum 50% of the fellowship duration spent at the non-academic sector



Who Applies?

- Consortia of universities, research institutions, businesses including SMEs and other non-academic actors like NGOs, Charities, Hospitals, government institutions, etc.
- At least three independent legal entities, each established in a different MS or AC; minimum of 1 beneficiary from a MS (on top of this minimum, any entity from any third country can join; no minimum for associated partners).
- Average DN consortium size: 8-10 partners.



Eligible Researchers

- Supported researchers must be **doctoral candidates**
- Researchers must be enrolled in a doctoral programme, in at least 1 EU Member State/Associated Country
- For Industrial Doctorates, candidate must spend minimum 50% of fellowship at non-academic partner
- Any nationality
- Mobility rule: must not have resided or carried out main activity in the country of the recruiting beneficiary for more than 12 months in the 36 months immediately before their recruitment date

DNs Strategic Value (1): Structuring Effects

- MSCA DN does not simply fund the fellowships; it funds networks/doctoral programmes.
- Powerful element in structuring the EHEA and the ERA.
- Structuring effects for universities; deep collaboration culture and administrative infrastructure becoming part of the DNA of Higher Education Institutions.



DNs Strategic Value (2): Being a trend setter

- Training on transferable skills (communication, science-policy interface, IPR...) at individual and network levels
- Career development plan
- New guidelines on supervision
- Green Charter (also for other MSCAs)
- Bridging Academic and Non-Academic: Industrial Doctorate; Inter-Sectoral Secondments.
- Bringing science to the Public (including children)



DNs Strategic Value (3): Attractiveness of European programmes

- Attractive for doctoral candidates, universities and employers.
- Access to wider portfolio of courses, expertise and infrastructure for **doctoral candidates**.
- As well as skills relevant for innovation and long-term employability
- Formal acknowledgement of international and interdisciplinary experiences providing more attractiveness to employers.
- Contribute to **internationalisation**, attractiveness international visibility of European doctoral programmes





Academic sector

Consortium of min. **3 legal** entities in **3 different** countries, 2 of which in a different EU Member State or HE Associated Country


Non-academic sector

If organisations from the **same sector**, there must be at least 1 organisation from a nonassociated Third Country*

Secondments within different European Union Member States (EU MS) or Horizon Europe Associated Countries (HE AC).must be between different sectors (between academic and non-academic), except for interdisciplinary secondments, which must be limited to a maximum of 1/3 of the total implemented months.

* With one or several beneficiaries or associated partners.

MSCA Staff Exchanges









DURATION 4 years COMPOSITION Min 3 organisations in 3 ≠ countries (min. 2 EU MS or HE AC)

SECONDMENTS 1-12 months per staff

BUDGET Max EUR 1.6 million (360 PM per project)


