

European Master in Official Statistics (EMOS) Master's Thesis Competition

Call for submissions by 11 October 2024

1. Purpose

The purpose of the EMOS Master's Thesis Competition (MTC) is to reward outstanding master's theses developed by students enrolled in <u>EMOS-labelled master's programmes</u>. It seeks to highlight official statistics as a research topic and put forward young talents with innovative contributions.

To showcase the results of research in official statistics conducted by EMOS graduates to the wider scientific community, up to six winners of the MTC will have the possibility to present their master's theses at the New Techniques and Technologies for Statistics (NTTS) conference, an international biennial scientific conference series organised by Eurostat on 11-13 March 2025 in Brussels.

2. Eligibility

In order to be eligible, the candidates must have:

- graduated from an <u>EMOS labelled master's programme</u> in the academic years 2022/2023 or 2023/2024.
- 2. completed a master's thesis before the closing date of the current call for submissions,
- 3. been nominated by their university's EMOS coordinator to participate in the MTC.

3. Submission process

EMOS coordinators send up to three submissions by **11 October 2024** at the latest to the EMOS Secretariat at estat-emos@ec.europa.eu.

A submission template and all relevant instructions for the preparation of the submissions are provided in Annex 1.

4. Evaluation

The evaluation committee consists of the members of the <u>EMOS Board</u>. The submitted abstracts will be evaluated according to the following criteria:

- 1. Clearly developed objectives and methodology: the used research methods must be explained in a coherent way, with clarity and readability,
- 2. Results fitting to the proposed objectives: a clear connection must be drawn between the research goals and the outcomes,

- Conclusions for application in official statistics or further research: possibilities for deploying the research results must be explained or, alternatively, suggestions for further research must be made,
- 4. Contribution: it must be elaborated how the thesis offers a new and original insight'.

5. Announcement of the winners

The winners will be announced in **December 2024**. The announcement will be published on the <u>EMOS website</u>. The winners and their EMOS coordinators will be informed by the EMOS Secretariat via e-mail.

6. Awards

1. Presentation of the thesis during the NTTS conference with travel and accommodation covered

Up to six winners of the MTC will have the possibility to present their master's theses in the <u>NTTS</u> conference taking place between 11 and 13 March 2025 in Brussels. The travel expenses and accommodation of the winners from their place of study to the conference venue will be covered by Eurostat.

2. Certificates and promotion

The winners of the MTC (authors and their academic supervisors) will receive a certificate. The abstracts of the winning master's theses will be published on the NTTS and EMOS homepages.

2. EMOS abstract

The abstract must

- clearly convey the objectives, research methods, main results and conclusions, as well as distinguish new and creative insights;
- be written in English;
- be no longer than max. 5 pages in font 12 points;
- contain max. 3 tables or figures (not included in the max. of 5 pages);
- provide max. 3 keywords specifying the domain of the thesis;
- provide main references (not included in the max. of 5 pages).

The submission file must also contain:

- table of contents of the whole thesis in English
- full thesis in original language

1. Introduction

2. Objective

Expose here the main objectives of your research.

3. Methods

Explain the methods used to reach your objectives.

4. Results

Summarise your results. Conclusions for application in official statistics or further research: possibilities for deploying the research results must be explained or, alternatively, suggestions for further research must be made.

5. Contribution

Explain how your research offers a new and original insight.

References

Provide main references (not included in the max. of 5 pages).

Attachment 1: Table of content

Provide table of contents of the thesis in English (not included in the max. of 5 pages).

Attachment 2: Full thesis in original language

Provide a full thesis in original language.

3. Qualitative assessment for the selection To be written by the EMOS coordinator, max. 2000 words.
